project using different mediums. Stenciling is
as old as prehistoric man and has been
dated as far back as 9000 years ago on cave
walls. It is a well thought out way to
reproduce the same pattern over and over.
Dictionaries state that a stencil is an
impervious material in which openings have
been cut out so that ink or paint may be
applied to a surface.

Immigrants brought stenciling with them to the new world and used it for decoration in the home, on furniture and in works of art.

Fabrics, clocks, mirrors, boxes, trays, floor covering, utensils, walls, ceilings, pottery and tin ware were stenciled in early homes.

Popular subjects were fruit, flowers and Shells. Later it was widened to include animals, ships, buildings and birds. Stencils may be hand drawn and cut.



Artist SPOTLIGHT Carol Stebbins



Most of you probably know Carol from her consistent presence in our league functions. To say that she is a true asset to the league would be an understatement since she is an unusually active member, serving simultaneously in a variety of key roles. That said, I find it interesting that, just as with her league roles, the list of mediums that she has worked with also has quite a variety. This list includes pastel, watercolor, charcoal, ink, printing, batik, and mixed media. And if that list were not enough, she now intends to get into the three-dimensional realm, trying her hand at repousse' (metal works).

When asked if she had a favorite medium, she said that she felt the most satisfaction coming from her printing. Her work there was mainly with lithography (limestone block) and zinc plate. Both are quite involved processes that I could only begin to describe here, so if you're at all curious, I'm sure she'd be glad to discuss the subject in more detail.

Carol is originally from the Canal Zone but moved to the Tampa Bay area in 1951. Then it was in 1967 that she began pursuing a Fine Arts degree at the young USF campus. Unfortunately, after three years of classes, I guess you could say that life started to get in the way of her schooling, and she had to step away. She had pretty much finished all the art curriculum needed for the degree, but some main-stream academic requirements remained a final hurdle to achieving a sheepskin. It wouldn't be until the 91/92 academic year that she would resume the effort and enroll in the International Academy of Design (here in Tampa) and finally earn her degree. While her formal education didn't begin until 1967, her interest in art began long before. She explained that even as a preschooler, she was fascinated by art and her little hands were simply determined to create. But with no true art supplies, she would find burned matches in ashtrays and use them as one would use charcoal. Then for drawing paper she would find old envelopes to use as the surface for her creations; quite a determined attitude for one that young.

As the years progressed, her interest evolved into a passion. But that passion still had the challenge of obtaining art supplies. So, with art being such an important priority to her, she again had to develop a solution. As a toddler, the "match and envelope" approach solved the problem, but now she needed more substantial supplies, and again, her creative mind found a way. I guess the term "starving artist" would be somewhat appropriate because her solution was to save her lunch money to use for buying the needed supplies.

Many years have passed since then and fortunately the monetary aspect is no longer an issue. There are still challenges, but now they are more specific to the creative process. She says it's sometimes challenging, waiting for true inspiration. She doesn't want to just participate in mere exercises and create generic meaningless art. Her passion for art has created a desire to effectively pass on that same sense of inspiration of her works to others, and ideas for such pieces don't always come easy.

Relating to inspiration, when asked about her favorite artists, Picasso and Dali were the first to come to mind. But while they inspired her, she hasn't fallen into the common trap of trying to mimic an artist's work. Instead, she seems to have fed from their creative mindset of diverting from the norm, but in her own way. Her favorite subject matter is "figure studies", and it shows. Unlike some art or even photography that give a sense of an image being an instant frozen in time, some of her figure studies seem to defy the reality of being a single static image on paper and instill a sense of movement. It's a style that I think Picasso and Dali could have appreciated.

Maybe as art league members, we should appreciate the fact that Carol is not more frequently visited by the muse of Inspiration, as it has allowed her time to lend her passion to the league and help it function. But as these inspirations do come, I'm sure we will get to see some impressive fruits of such inspiration on the walls of our art
