


# A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

# Artist SPOTLIGHT

# Gunni (Nilsson) Price

It was 1958, the last full year that our flag would fly with forty-eight stars. Two more wouldn't be added until 1959, but a new star was being added to our art world that year with Gunni arriving from her homeland of Sweden. Some of you may know Gunni as the league member that brings the home-made appetizers to our monthly meetings. Then again you may not since she does so quite humbly and quiet.

Gunni, born in Stockholm Sweden, said that even as a young girl she had an interest, and maybe even a fascination with art. She was in a country and continent rich in art and art history, and with no television in that era, it was more common for art to find its way into the eyes and hearts of youngsters. Living in Europe, she had the privilege of seeing fine works first-hand in churches and museums. During that era of her life, although she excelled at art in school, she didn't actively engage in any real method of creating her own art. Even so, for decades, she maintained a mindset that "One day I'm going to paint."



Finally, around 1970, while living in Fort Meade as the wife of a U.S. Army aviator, she came upon the catalyst that she needed. She had heard a lot of talk around the post about an instructor from Europe that held classes in oils and finally decided it was time to give it a try. She said that his instruction gave her the firm foundation that she needed for creating her own work.

I'm sure many of us can remember our first attempt at painting, and how amateur or unpolished it may have appeared, but this wasn't the case with Gunni. Her first piece looked more like it was done by someone more familiar with the medium, and was worthy of any art show living room wall.

To this day, Gunni paints solely in oils, and also says there's something enjoyable in creating large pieces that involve long graceful brush strokes. But while some of her pieces are quite large, in the vicinity of 2,500 square inches, she has also been very successful painting miniatures.

That class at Fort Meade was pretty much the extent of her art training. For the most part she has avoided other art classes because she doesn't want to be steered away from painting in her own style. Another thing she avoids is commissions, preferring to paint as she is so inspired. While she has done some excellent portraits and still-life, they are not her more likely subjects. In her larger pieces, her favorites tend to be tropical in nature, while for miniatures, she prefers landscapes. Her own style and subject matter has been a recipe that worked well, winning more awards than I can mention here. And aside from contests and such, she has had displays in the "Thunderdome" and at our Tampa International Airport where she said she was fortunate to have made her most lucrative sale.







As mentioned above, she was the wife of an Army pilot, Lieutenant Colonel Robert (Bob) Price. The two were happily married for 58 years. His Army career was during a time when there was an expectation by the Army that the wives were to be supporting participants in post social functions. As such, another of her talents was frequently showcased as on occasion, she was asked to cook for generals and their foreign dignitaries. Perhaps this is something our league has benefited from as that same expertise often finds its way into the appetizers at the monthly meetings.

Gunni is truly a multi-faceted individual who speaks three languages. She is very health conscious working out at the gym three times a week. She used to enjoy the activity of "compass orienteering", but that's an event which unfortunately is all but gone now with the advent of the global positioning system (GPS) devices. Her other interests include crocheting, embroidery and on occasion, old furniture make-overs, all of which she does at a similar level to the quality of her art.

Well, it's now been fifty-five years since Gunni took those lessons, back at Fort Meade. In that span she's created countless quality pieces, and she's not done yet, slowing down just slightly. So, I'm sure it will be a pleasure seeing the wonders she'll have for our future shows.

# 1 - Who can Enter?

Members in good standing may submit art for our show.

# 2 – What are the physical requirements and restrictions on the art?

- a. A member can submit up to two pieces of art.
  - b. Each piece may not exceed:
  - 961 square inches (this includes the frame).
  - \*31" x 31" happens to be 961 square inches.
    - 25 Pounds in weight.
- c. 3D works can only be accepted if they can be hung on the CJT display racks.
  - d. All pieces must be properly fitted with wire for hanging.
  - As usual, this means no sawtooth or screw eyes. \* (see photo below)
- e. All entries must be properly framed. Canvas wraps are considered to be properly framed.
- f. Pieces must not have tags, stickers or ribbons from previous shows.



## 3 – Are there any additional requirements or restrictions?

- a. All entries must be the original piece. Sorry, no reproductions or commercial prints.
  - b. All entries must remain on exhibit throughout the entire length of the exhibit.

Anything removed early may disqualify the member from prizes or future shows.

- c. All entries must have been completed within the last 5 years.
- d. All entries must not have received an award in a previous BLFA show.
- e. All entries must be ORIGINAL work and created solely by the artist. So:

No copies of the works of other artists,

No copies of instruction book lessons.

No copies of teacher demonstrated works or teacher assisted work will be accepted.

No works from commercial molds.

f. Because children visit the gallery, works containing nudity, or horror are not accepted

# 4 – Is this a "juried show"?

No, this is not a juried show.

So, all works that meet the eligibility requirements within Rules 1,2 & 3 will be accepted.

### 5 - Will there be awards?

Yes, awards to be given will be determined at the discretion of the exhibit committee.

These are our expectations as we plan the show:

1st. place: 50% of taking in.

2nd. Place: 30% of taking in.

3rd. place: 15% of taking in.

Honorable Mention:

Prize money and number of awards will be determined by show participation.

From the Heart Award: TBD. Sponsored by the Bay Area Cardiologists.

People's Choice Award: Free single person BLFA Membership for 2026.

\*Note: There is no category distinction.

### 6 - How are winners determined?

A qualified professional will judge the show, except for the "People's Choice Award". The "People's Choice Award" is determined by votes of the members and public that view the show.

### 7 – Can we sell our work at the show?

Yes, you can sell your work. The price should be placed on the entry form.

Any sales will be handled directly with the artist and no commission due.

Keep in mind, all entries must remain on exhibit throughout the entire length of the exhibit.

- 8 What other details do we need to know to enter?
- a. The event location is: Creative Junk Therapy, 776 Lumsden Rd. LaViva Plaza Brandon.
  - b. The Entry Fee is \$15.00 (cash or check).

\*2 Entries for \$25.

c. The Take-In day is: Sunday, March 30th 2025 1:00 to 4:00

d. The Pick-Up day is: Wednesday, April 30th. (Time TBD).

e. The Chairperson is Guy Learn.

f. IMPORTANT:

LIABILITY: At the time of delivery of artwork to Creative Junk Therapy and the Members' Show committee the artist must sign the entry slip, which acts as a declaration discharging the BLFA, its committee members and all other participating and sponsoring organization from any and all manner of actions, suits, damages or claims whatsoever arising from any loss or damage to the property of the artist while in the possession or supervision of the BLFA Members' Show committee. The artist agrees to abide by the Members' Show rules and understands the Committee reserves the right to make the final interpretation of the rules.

### SIZE CALCULATIONS:

Figuring the square inch area of your piece is simple, assuming they are square or rectangular. Simply multiply the length by the width. (Include the frame in the measurements)

If it happens to be round, use this formula: 3.14 times (the radius times the radius).



The purpose of the Brandon League of Fine Arts is to inspire interest in the arts through educational programs, to promote advancement of members by providing opportunities to exhibit their work, and to serve the community through enrichment of the cultural climate. In 1959, a group of Brandon area artists and art lovers organized to support and encourage the cultural life of the greater Brandon area, these dedicated men and women formed an organization called the Brandon Area Art Center, but changed its name to the Brandon League of Fine Arts (BLFA) in 1977.



In the 1980s, the scope of activities and events changed and expanded to reflect the ever-evolving interests of League members. In addition to monthly meetings and fine art demonstrations, noteworthy activities included a student scholarship, an annual Members' Show, Artworks Show, and a national Square Off competition.

In 2023, the BLFA established a new collaboration with a highly creative and environmentally-conscience business and 5013c, Creative Junk Therapy. This location really helps the League spread our wings with more space and a wider audience.




