Artist Spotlight

Roxanne Tobaison

If you were to look up "artist" in the dictionary, you would find a simple description such as "A person who produces paintings or drawings as a profession or hobby." But that just begins to touch on the true sense. Just as some are "called" into the ministry, I also believe that some are called to being an artist. And for Roxanne, this began at an early age as a young girl, although it would be decades before she could act on the calling. Even as a child, she had a genuine appreciation for landscapes as well as many other of God's wonders. While, for some, it takes the more majestic wonders of this world to find any inspiration, it was the simpler things that called to Roxanne, like being taken in by the colors of a sunrise as she walked to the bus stop, just wishing she could paint it. Unfortunately, back then, art supplies would have been a luxury in her humble home, so such desires would have to wait.

By the 70's, tole painting was a popular activity and was her first real venture into the art world. While this may have been a useful portal into being an artist, she soon got bored with this "one stroke" painting style and the tracing that usually accompanied it and tried her hand at oil painting. This in turn led to trying yet other mediums and in the late 70's she eventually found the one that suited her best, and that was watercolor.

While settling into this medium, rather than looking to colleges and art institutes for guidance, she sought out more practical opportunities which consisted mainly of watercolor workshops. And rather than studying under a single artist, she found it advantageous to learn from a variety of experts, including: Claude Croney, Tom Lynch, Ken Hawk, Marilyn Jacobs, Jo Tarabula and Jerry MCClish. Doing so, she was able to glean nuggets and useful tips from each, eventually settling into her own style. This led to a long an ongoing journey, as she has now been exhibiting in artist festivals for close to 30 years

Roxanne's preferred subjects are Florida birds, landscapes, and being a Tampa native, historic and other landmarks of the bay area. The latter came into play with some of her more notable commissioned work which involved multiple depictions of the operations at MacDill Air Force Base. These were done at the request of the 6th Air Mobility Wing commander, Colonel Maggie Woodward. (Now Retired Major General Woodward). Many other works of hers were also distinctly local, and if you've lived here long enough, you may have unknowingly owned some of her art as she designed the cover for the Brandon Chamber of Commerce Phone book (the Brandon white pages) in 96.


Other accomplishments by Roxanne include:

- o Designer for the Old Hyde Park Village Art Festival t-shirt artist (1993)
- Judge for Manatee Arts Festival and featured t-shirt artist 2006 & 2007

- o Selected into the rampa bay Lightning Celebration of the Arts (2015 & 2016) garnering 3rd place in 2015.
- o Twice Judging the Temple Terrace Arts Festival including their 50th year Anniversary (2023).

Roxanne credits her talent as "a gift from God" and as such, has been compelled to give back. So, as you may know, the student eventually became the teacher, and she has now been instructing others in the joys of watercolor painting for decades. Her "giving" has also highly benefited our art league, as over the years, her guidance has been instrumental in the successful operations of our league as she has unselfishly held every office in our league.






















