Artist Charlotte DeMolay

When she was growing up, folks might have guessed that Charlotte was destined to be an engineer due to her serious interests in math and science. And while she also loved to draw, she regarded art as a mere hobby. So, it may be to the credit of some of her teachers, back then, that encouraged her creative work that led her to keep art classes on her agenda when she entered college. As she puts it, “My major was a circuitous route.” As early as high school, she intended to study Mechanical Engineering but ended up

starting off with Accounting at a community college. But she switched to Interior Design while enrolled at University of North Carolina at Greensboro where she ultimately decided to graduate with a Fine Art degree with a concentration in Design. But that degree was far from an end goal as she considers herself to be a lifelong student. As such, she continues taking classes when the opportunity arises, but more important is the never-ending “lab” portion of the journey as she learns by creating.

While continuing this perpetual education, she’s also helped others along their way. For about 15 years she taught art at nonprofits, a private school and in her own studio when living in Texas.

As with most of us, Charlotte has what she considers to be her favorite artists. Some of these include Toulouse-Lautrec, Alphonse Mucha and Georgia O’Keefe. And whether this appreciation came from art classes, museums or elsewhere, their influence has pleasantly translated into some very aesthetic impressionistic images from her studio that are an excellent blend of design and art.

Getting back to her creative journey, Charlotte says that the easiest part of creating is coming up with ideas. There seems to be no shortage, and since she’s been drawing for so long, when she slows down and settles into some new

work, she’s confident that she can render a pretty close version to what she’s seeing. And “seeing” is an important aspect of her art. While her final works are of an impressionistic nature, she keeps the shapes and designs very true-to-life and relies on her secondary hobby of photography to gather images to make practical models for her art.

What she does find challenging about her creative process is dealing with a lack of patience. She recognizes a tendency to work too fast to properly translate an artistic image from her mind to the canvas. As a result, the few times she’s tried oil paints have resulted in what she calls “mud.” And although she loves watercolors, because of the impulse to work too fast, she struggles with that medium as well. Curiously though, she’s managed to turn that impatient trait



into an advantage. She often has maybe four or five paintings in the works at any given time and says that, in the end, it forces her to go a little slower.

Being that she does work more quickly than some, it should come as no surprise that her favorite medium is working in acrylics. She likes to work in layers and explore with textures, so acrylic's fast-drying property plays well in her style. She also likes the cost-effective aspect of the medium. As she says, "Even the cheapest acrylics will outlive all of us!" And then there's the obvious advantage. One that also applies to oils, that I'm so familiar with, and that is, you can paint over mistakes. Although acrylics are her favorite, she doesn't limit herself to such. She's done work in watercolors, been experimenting with mixed media, and although it's been a while, pastel. She says she loves pastels, but they are so messy to frame and ship that she will shy away from that medium but certainly hasn't removed it from her repertoire.



Charlotte has done a variety of commissions over the years creating anything from book illustrations to indoor murals. Then with the more common surfaces like canvas or paper, she's done a variety of pet portraits, landscapes, flowers and abstracts. These are quite close to her favorite subjects which include natural subjects from wildlife, plants to people.

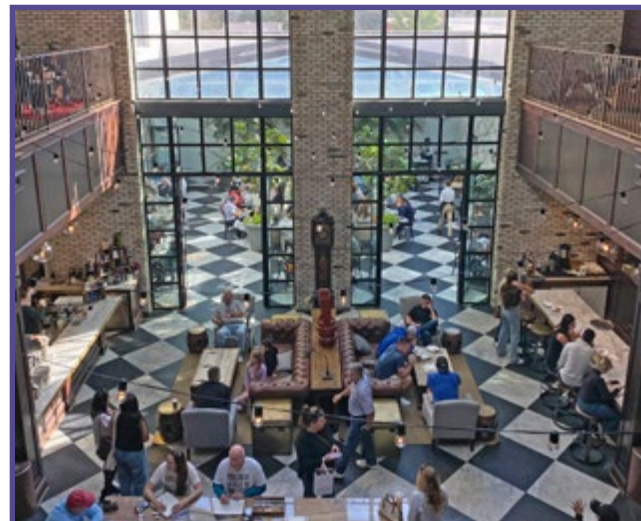
